Uniform

As a school, we have very clear principles about how our school uniform can reflect our aspirations and exceptional standards. Recently, shorts and skirts worn by the girls are getting increasingly short and tight. Some shorts are resembling hot pants and despite being worn over tights, are not suitable for school. Shorts and skirts should not be shorter than 2 inches above the knee. Likewise, leggings, jeggings and jeans are not the same as grey trousers.

Our policy is based on the notion that a school uniform:
Sets a tone for the high expectations of our school
Creates uniformity and equality with all children
Fosters a feeling of identity and belonging to the school
Promotes pride amongst our children and a sense of
feeling smart.

General Guidelines

'Extreme' haircuts are not permitted in school.

'Extreme' being any haircut that is considered by the school to be significantly different so as to cause distraction to others and therefore their learning and so not in keeping with the school's ethos. Examples of haircuts not permitted include tram lines or equivalent, shaved sides with longer hair across the centre, use of hair products such as gel. This list is not exhaustive.

When joining the school, parents/carers are expected to fully support this policy at all times.

Long hair should be tied back at all times and short hair in a suitable style for school. Plain hair bands are permitted.

No jewellery, except small, plain studs for pierced ears and wrist watches – both of which must be removed for P.E. (ear studs can be covered with plasters for the first few weeks until earrings can be safely removed).

No make-up or nail varnish to be worn in school.

Children may wear caps or hats to protect themselves from the sun or adverse weather conditions.

All headwear must be of plain colour. These items are not to be worn indoors.

Any request to change uniform on religious grounds can be discussed with the headteacher.

Children in Reception – Year 4 need to use a school book bag. Children in years 5 & 6 can use a rucksack.

All children need a clear & labelled water bottle bought into school daily.

PLEASE MAKE SURE ALL ITEMS OF CLOTHING ARE NAMED.

WEATHER:



As the weather gets colder and snow is forecast, please ensure you send your children in with warm clothes.

Tights are great but the girls do need a pair of socks for when they do PE so please pop a pair in their kit bag.

Wellies – if it snows we will allow those with wellies to go and play in the snow. If your child arrives in wellies please ensure they have their school shoes or plimsols with them along with an extra pair of socks/tights in case they get their feet wet. Our radiators are not the ones in which you can dry clothes on and we don't have a tumble dryer in school.

As usual, please ensure all items are named.

In the case of a snow day, we will endeavour to email parents as soon as we know if school is not safe to open. Please also look on social media for updates.

Please remember staff come from all over the county (Mrs BK is on the Milton Keyne's border) so snow does differ in these areas and it may be we can open but not with all staff on site. We will endeavour to do our best and ensure the safety of all at all times.

With no caretaker, gritting is not always able to be completed in the mornings. Where possible, we are gritting after school however please do stick to the paths, be careful on the sloped and stepped areas and use the railings for support.
