



## Hall Meadow Primary School



### SEND ON A PAGE JANUARY 2024

There are currently 23 children on our SEND register (11%). This is below the National Average of 17.3% (2022/2023).

This can be broken down further to 10.4% of our children have SEND needs (National average 13%) and 0.96% have EHCP's (National average 4.3%).

#### Areas of Need

1. Communication & Interaction 39.1%
2. Cognition & Learning 30.4%
3. Physical & Sensory 17.4%
4. Social, Emotional & Mental Health 13%

This shows that Communication & Interaction is the primary SEND need at Hall Meadow for 23/24

- At Hall Meadow there are currently two children with EHCP's.
- No RSA's are currently underway due to restrictions within the Educational Psychology Service.
- Following Outreach support from Rowan Gate it has now been made possible for there to be 3 High Needs Funding applications made for 2024.
- One child who has toileting difficulties, requires an Intimate Care Plan.
- No children currently require a Positive Handling Plan.
- Three children with medical needs have Individual Health Plans (IHP's)

**Educational Psychologist (Naomi Cumberland)** 4 days commissioned to oversee updating of EHCP advices, support for children with Emotionally Based School Avoidance & whole staff training on Attachment and Trauma

Educational Psychologists have been advised that they are currently only able to prioritise children who fall within 1 of 3 categories:-

1. Children at risk of exclusion,
2. Children who require new advices written for a change of placement
3. Children that come under the category of Emotionally Based School Avoidance (EBSA).

They currently cannot carry out new assessment work either for statutory assessment or otherwise. This has been the reason why we currently have no RSA's underway. However, with the introduction of Rowan Gate Outreach support the school has been able to make 5 referrals. 3 of these referrals will ultimately lead to applications to High Needs Funding and eventually RSA's

### IN SCHOOL-REFERRALS 2023-2024

**BLOSSOM-SALT (Libby Fraterrigo)** 4 days commissioned **23/24** to focus on EYFS (new starters), individual assessments, training and modelling to staff

**BLOSSOM-OT (Rachael Gartland)** 4 days commissioned **23/24** to focus on sensory needs within the school, in class observations and direct support.
