

## Hall Meadow Sport Premium Grant: 2020 – 2021

### Context:

Sport Premium funding at Hall Meadow Primary School is used to encourage healthy lifestyles and develop sporting ability. To do this, we spend our Sports Premium Grant in four areas:

1. Quality PE lessons
2. Active playground
3. Intra-school sport
4. Inter-school sport

### 1. Quality PE Lessons

**AIM:** For all pupils to be able to access high quality, active and well-resourced PE lessons throughout the school.
